Dear San Diego Parks Foundation Supporter:

This Fall the San Diego Parks Foundation celebrated its third anniversary. As Chair, I am incredibly proud to share our accomplishments and excited for what we plan to achieve in the New Year.

Since November 2018, the San Diego Parks Foundation has raised nearly \$2 million to support recreation programs that have served more than 20,000 youth and families, invested in facility upgrades at neglected recreation centers, planted more than 200 trees in parks located in communities that lack green space, and worked to close the digital divide by installing free public Wi-Fi at more than fifty City recreation centers and pools.

The Fall was a busy time as always. We celebrated the grand opening of two beautiful new facilities with community celebrations – the J Street Mini Park in the neighborhood of Stockton, and the grand opening of Park de la Cruz, a brand-new facility in City Heights that will serve as the new home for the City of San Diego Age Well and Recreational Therapeutic Services.

We recognized key City Parks & Recreation staff for their incredible support in implementing Come Play Outside, an initiative to provide summer enrichment activities at parks for youth and families. We are proud to share that in collaboration with the City of San Diego and funding partners, more than 16,000 youth and families participated in summer activities.

Our development committee is hard at work on our annual fundraiser that is held at the world-famous Torrey Pines golf course, the 4th Annual Undertow Charity Golf Classic on February 2<sup>nd</sup>. It is my pleasure to report we sold out in just twenty days! We are still looking for sponsors - the proceeds will support the revitalization of the Linda Vista Recreation Center.

This November, we joined the San Diego Public Library Foundation to announce the beginning of a community effort to bring a measure that would create a dedicated public revenue source to support parks and libraries to voters in November 2022. As advocates, we believe a dedicated revenue stream that is restricted for maintenance, operations, programming, staffing, and capital upgrades will ensure San Diego has the public parks and libraries required to create a healthy, sustainable, and thriving City.

We can't do this work without the support of our donors. As you consider your charitable giving for the remainder of the year, please consider continuing to support our work with a year-end contribution.



#### MEET THE COME PLAY OUTSIDE TEAM!

The San Diego Parks Foundation set an ambitious goal of reaching 16,638 San Diegans for Come Play Outside 2021. In partnership with the City of San Diego Performance and Analytics Department, we analyzed registration and survey data, and are pleased to report we exceeded our goal, and served 16,680 attendees! Additionally, more than 90% of care givers were extremely satisfied with the quality of programs. To recognize the hard work of the City staff in collaborating with the Parks Foundation to implement programming this summer, we held a recognition ceremony honoring their contribution.
