This past April, SDPF participated in a celebration of Arbor Day with City officials and Urban Corps of San Diego. Mayor Gloria acknowledged the progress of SDPF's tree planting efforts and its role in meeting the City's Climate Action goals. Since February, 21 trees were planted at Mountain View. Dear San Diego Parks Foundation Supporter:

It is with great pleasure that I share the San Diego Parks Foundation has surpassed a major milestone. We have raised more than \$1 million to support San Diego's community and neighborhood parks! This would not have been possible without the amazing support of our generous donors and community partners and the hard working leadership team and staff in the City of San Diego Parks & Recreation Department.

I am pleased to announce that Phase I of the Free WiFi initiative is near completed. In partnership with Lokket Free WiFi San Diego, we have installed WiFi at 23 recreation centers, and have pledged to provide WiFi at all 57 recreation centers across the City. The project has been well received and funded by many individuals, family foundations and The San Diego Foundation, thank you!

In March, we planted 21 trees at Mountain View Park, and have begun work to plant 40 new trees at Willie Henderson Park that is anticipated to be completed soon. By the end of 2021, more than 200 trees will be planted since the launch of the tree-plating initiative. On April 23rd in celebration of Arbor Day, I was pleased to be invited to join Mayor Todd Gloria to share our recent tree planting accomplishments and recognize the Urban Corps of San Diego County for their significant role in meeting the City's urban canopy goals.

This spring we have spent significant time and resources working closely to launch the Come Play Outside. This new initiative will benefit youth in 16 of the most under-served neighborhoods in the City of San Diego under Mayor Todd Gloria's SUMMER FOR ALL OF US initiative. Program goals include providing enriching, equitable, and culturally relevant youth recreation opportunities that promote health and wellness. Additionally, the program will offer free family events intended to bring people together in a safe and friendly environment such as Movies in the Park and Fern Street Circus events. This project is anticipated to serve more than 17,000 children

and families and represents a powerful public-private partnership. Our key partners include the County of San Diego at the recommendation of Supervisor Nathan Fletcher, Price Philanthropies Foundation, and Walmart Foundation. San Diego Parks Foundation is proud to be the lead on this very important initiative.

Additionally, as part of Come Play Outside, I am pleased to announce the San Diego Parks Foundation is the recipient of a generous grant from the Albertsons Foundation Nourishing Neighbors program to provide food at summer park programs and events. This grant will help provide much needed assistance to the children in our community impacted by food insecurity.

Thank you for your continued support and interest in our work. I look forward to continuing to partnership together to build healthier and more resilient communities.
