

Early this summer, the San Diego Parks Foundation joined Mayor Todd Gloria, County Supervisor Board Chair Nathan Fletcher, Councilmember Monica Montgomery-Steppe, representatives from the Parks and Recreation Department, and the Martin Luther King Junior Recreation Council to launch Come Play Outside. This summer thousands of children and families have come to our city parks to experience enriching recreational programs, outdoor community performances, teen programs, and family movie nights. For these special families, it has been a summer of joy creating lasting memories.

I would like to personally extend my gratitude to our donors: Price Philanthropies Foundation, the JEM Project, Walter J. & Betty C. What drew me into Parks and Recreation initially was the comradery with my peers, fun atmosphere and laid back feel!
